Key Activities:

- Ben Nesbitt, Program Director for Skilled Trades and Technical Sciences and Scott Stump, Dean of Career & Technical Education represented CCCS on the Oral Exam and Stakeholders review committee for the hiring process for the position of Director, Workforce Development Programs for Colorado Department of Labor & Employment.
- Hosted the National Technology Skills Association Conference for middle and high school students.

Student Success Goal: Colorado students shall have seamless opportunities to transition from high school into college and from two-year institutions into four-year institutions.

Key Activities:

- The Career & Technical Education section of Ed Services released a new Guide to Comprehensive Career Guidance that will pave the way for K 12 institutions to implement seamless plans of study and Individual Career & Academic Plans for every student in their district. - Math-in-CTE Program expanded to the Western Slope through an agreement with the Mesa County Perkins Consortium. Forty Math and CTE instructors received initial training and will continue to receive coaching and feedback throughout the year.
- Provided statewide training for implementation of concurrent enrollment programs.
- Participated in the review of the national mathematics and communication common model content standards review.

Student Success Goal: Colorado students shall have the opportunity to succeed through high quality, cutting-edge instruction and educational services.

Key Activities:

- Successfully transitioned secondary credentialing to the Colorado Department of education July 1, 2009. Process included comprehensive revisions of 32 sets of credentialing criteria and the development of common applications and procedures.
- Provided educational technology and resource training for nearly 300 secondary and postsecondary instructors and administrators at the summer Colorado Association of Career & Technical Education (CACTE) Conference.

- Implemented the web-based Common Course Numbering System tied directly to Banner data.
