Grantee Remarks:	Because UI data lags by 3 months, our employment numbers seem low. In addition, out of 2274 participants, we have wage data for only 1292 (56.8%) which indicates inaccuracy in SSN. Also the majority of our participants are employed when they start the program. They are underemployed and not employed in the field, but since they have some type of employment when they begin the program, they do not count for us as "Employed after completing POS" even if they do find employment in advanced manufacturing. For number of non completers retained in other programs, used NSC data so only CCCS colleges are available at this time. Retention data is a snapshot and not cumulative. This form does not allow submission unless number of males plus number of females equals the number of participants. That metric and the choices provided does not accommodate participants who prefer not to disclose or who identify with gender other than male or female.
